In September 2004, the Diocese of Oakland implemented the Safe Environment for Children Project in all Schools. In the Diocese of Oakland, the Safe Environment for Children Project, which has been mandated by Bishop Barber, includes four components that guide us in implementing the Charter. One of these components is the dissemination of curriculum for use in all Catholic Schools. One of the objectives of the education component of the Safe Environment for Children Project is to help children recognize the behaviors of others that may jeopardize their safety and to help them know what to do in the event that they find themselves at risk. This curriculum, which is implemented this week, is available for your review in the school office. Should you have any questions, please don’t hesitate to call your child’s teacher.</p>
<p align="center">Tardies</p> <p>When students arrive late at school they are not only disruptive to the classroom and instruction, but they also impact their grades negatively. In almost all grades instruction begins as soon as students enter classrooms. Almost always these activities are assessed and graded. When students come in late they do not get a chance to make up these works later on or even on a different day. This learning is also embedded in other subjects. In addition they miss out on instructions and plan for the day; in a way, they play catch up all day long! Tardies can also hurt you, the parents, in the pocket! Numbers of tardies add to Parent Hours. As indicated in the Student Parent Handbook, every 4 tardies count as one Parent Hour or \$25. Right now these numbers are added to your account in hours only, but after May 9 the hours will change to dollar amounts. If you need hours, please contact the office immediately.
